These free workshops are aimed at people from many cultural backgrounds so that they can teach waste minimisation courses in their own communities and in their own language.

Are you interested in helping people in your community learn new skills to help reduce waste at home and at work?

Kaipatiki Project is offering free training to adults from ethnic communities across Auckland, North Shore and Manukau cities. The 2 day programme will give participants

- Instruction in the principles of recycling, composting and waste reduction
- Tutoring skills so that they can pass on the waste minimisation message to others in their native language
- Professional support in setting up their own local workshop for their friends and neighbours
- An adult trainer tutoring certificate
- A free compost bin, worm farm or Bokashi system

Kaipatiki Project was established on the North Shore 12 years ago with the aim of inspiring communities to live sustainably. Volunteers play a large part in our forest restoration work, and help us develop our native plant nursery and teaching gardens in Birkdale.

For the last six years Kaipatiki Project's education team has delivered popular free composting workshops on behalf of Auckland, North Shore and Manukau City Councils.

This waste minimisation initiative is funded by the Ministry for the Environment's Sustainable Management Fund.
